Teddy bear whispers

It is not often that when the offering plate is passed in worship you see a stuffed animal in the plate. But that was the case last Sunday. Some kind soul had placed a small teddy bear in the offering plate that was passed in the center section of the Sanctuary. This simple gesture was fitting: one - because it was Teddy Bear Sunday, two - because the person who placed the bear attached a one dollar bill to the bear for our ongoing "Dollars for Mission" offering and three - it whispered "I care about you and that God loves you."

Dr. Day's sermon on Sunday was about searching for God - at times we expect God to reveal himself to us with a shout. But as Dr. Day explained, it is in the whispers, the simple gestures of caring and compassion and the silent meditation time that we truly hear and experience God.

The bear symbolized the whispers that are heard in the church halls daily. The kind gesture to a homeless man or woman who just wants to sit inside to stay warm - if only just for a few minutes, the family assisted at the Mission with groceries, the baby who receives infant formula at the Mission, the homeless person who receives a sack lunch, the family who gets a check from the Helping Hands fund to help pay a utility bill, the child who hears the birth story for the first time from their Sunday school teacher, the youth who experiences hands on mission work for the first time...

Make a decision to help some in need this Christmas season and in doing so you will whisper to them - "I care for you, you are special and God loves you."

The annual Teddy Bear Sunday was a wonderful success. Hundreds of teddy bears were donated. The bears will be given to the children who visit the Infant Formula Program and the Mission this holiday season.

Give "One" for Mission & Outreach

This past summer Dr. Day proposed that we try an experiment. The suggestion was that those in worship place a one-dollar bill in the collection plate as it passed by. Since many people pay their pledge monthly, quarterly, with stock or even a credit card, many no longer have the experience of responding to God's Word and love during the service. This would give all of us the emotional and spiritual feeling of giving. It would also avoid that empty feeling of the plate passing by without a response. In the early church, after the sermon, a collection was taken which was sent out immediately to the widows, the poor, the sick and the less fortunate. Dr. Day's suggestion was that every one-dollar bill placed in the offering plate go directly to mission and outreach. All this is above and beyond the fact that these dollars can make a difference in people's lives.

As of December 1 a total of \$12,770 has been given. Thank you for your generosity.
